



## Episcopal Diocese of Missouri Jubilee Ministries

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,  
because he has anointed me

In 1982, the 67<sup>th</sup> General Convention of the Episcopal Church affirmed that a "ministry of joint discipleship in Christ with poor and oppressed people, wherever they are found, to meet basic human needs and to build a just society" is at the heart of the mission of the church. That resolution further directed the Executive Council to implement and coordinate with other programs of the Church a priority ministry commitment by this Church to be called "The Jubilee Ministry."

Hundreds of Jubilee Ministry Centers across this Church continue to work at a grass roots level to meet basic human needs of water, food, housing, healthcare, education, employment, and a healthy environment. In addition, there are those working for a just immigration policy, racial and cultural affirmation, equal protection under the law, and economic opportunities. This is the work of Jubilee.

Currently, the Diocese of Missouri has 3 designated Jubilee Ministry Centers:

St. Louis – Trinity Food Ministry at Trinity Church in the Central West End – 1987  
Poplar Bluff – Holy Cross Episcopal Church – 2016  
Cape Girardeau – Red Door Ministry, Christ Episcopal Church – 2017
