

Annual Report of the Archivist and Registrar - 2022

The Archives of the Diocese of Missouri includes document and photograph collections, our library, the official records of the Standing Committee, Parochial Trust Fund and the Corporation of the Diocese of Missouri, Diocesan Council, diocesan journals, diocesan newspapers, information about our bishops, our churches, our clergy, our properties and financial history. What we can learn from the past is so important.

But so is what we preserve for the future. I continue to gather and save not only paper, but the digital material, so it will be available for archivists and historians in 20 or 50 or 100 years. Much of the work in any archives is organizational, and ours is no different. I continue to work on our extensive backlog as well as new materials we receive each year. Next year, we will be adding additional material from St. Paul's Church, Palmyra and St. Matthew's, Mexico, both closed churches, to their parish files in the Archives.

For years, I have hoped to begin digitizing archival records. Last year, I prepared an initial plan and asked for funding to begin a multi-year program to digitize all Diocesan Journals from 1840 to the present, and ultimately make them searchable on line. While journals might not seem like the most fun records to read, they can provide the most valuable information about the history of the Diocese. This year, I was able to have our first 64 journals digitized. With funds I have requested for next year, the remainder of our journals will be digitized, and next year the collection will be prepared for an on-line exhibit. Going forward, I hope to have a digital project each year.

For the last three years, I have been unable to hold Archives workshops. Next year, I hope to have at least two workshops, perhaps on the Convocation or regional level. If your congregation would like to host a workshop, please let me know. In the meantime remember that part of my job is to provide archives assistance for congregations. If I can answer questions about what or how to organize and preserve your congregation's story please let me know.

If you would like to visit the Archives, please let me know. Now that the Archives is open again, I'm happy to welcome visitors.
