Communications and Technology

Preferred External Channels: Internet, TV and Radio (Spanish-language). Consider ads and other strategies to drive website traffic.

Preferred Internal Channels: Email, if well-produced.

Diversity-Related: May want to consider employing language/cultural-specific resources and channels (especially Spanish) and multiculturally-sensitive staff and volunteers.

Technology: Connected, knowledgeable about, and comfortable with technology.

Education/Formation

Educational Level: Two thirds of adults have some college or degree. Plan adult formation programs accordingly.

Household Description: Median Age: 30.7, Average Household Size: 3:10. Most are young couples with children.

Children by Age Range: Above national average of numbers of K-PreK, Grade School, and Middle School students. Average number in High School. Plan children's formation programs accordingly.

Diversity-Related: May want to consider employing multilingual (especially Spanish) and multicultural teachers and teaching resources.

Hospitality/Fellowship

Orientation: Tend to expect family-oriented and socially-oriented fellowship.

Diversity-Related: May want to consider recruiting multilingual (especially Spanish) and multiculturally-sensitive staff and volunteers.

Neighborhood Issues

Diversity: One-third non-white, with higher than average diversity: White 65.4%, Hispanic 26.7%, Black 14.8%, Other 8.7%, Asian/Pacific 6.2%, Multiple 4.2%, Native American

Economic: Income is more than 25% above national median. Most households have two or more people working.

Outreach

Orientation: Community involved. Highly involved in their children's activities.

Opportunities: Organize outreach around child-focused activities.

Stewardship/Finance

Median Household Income: \$64,000 (about 125% of national median).

Median Net Worth: \$96,000 (135% of national median).

Capacity for Giving. Some ability to give and are optimistic about their economic future.

Theological/Political Orientation

Liberal: As a whole, this population tends to exhibit liberal theopolitical preferences.

Worship


Age-Related: Consider family service, multigenerational service, and/or children-in-worship area and materials.
